## BROADWAY STATION DEVELOPMENTS

Over the last few months GWR volunteers working at the Broadway station site, have made considerable progress. The site has been made tidier, foundations of the original buildings are now clearly visible, and information boards have been erected. We have also recovered a quantity of imperial sized bricks on the site and from further afield. With these bricks and other materials, which have been kind-

ly donated to us, we in a position to start building a section of platform wall. Indeed, by the time this newsletter is published, we hope to have laid the first bricks. We are continuing to refine the details of the planned station buildings and the layout of the site.

The reconstruction of the station is a huge task for a volunteer workforce, so if there is anyone out there who would like to help us, we would be very grateful. You don't have to be able to lay bricks or

wield a pick and shovel, although if you feel you

would like to join us and do that, you would be made very welcome. Another way to help is by purchasing shares in the railway - our shareholders are entitled to various benefits dependant on the contribution. You could also become a member of the railway and enjoy annual free rides, as well as our quarterly magazine 'The Cornishman'. Alternatively,

## THE BASEY BROOK FLOOD RISK PROJECT

The following report has been received from Cllr. Liz Eyre:-

Building on the 1998 investigation, following on from the 2007 data collection, using updated 2-Dimensional hydraulic modelling techniques it has been ascertained that the quantity of flood water storage required to protect the 3 villages is around 88000m<sup>3</sup>. Scheme costs for the preferred option, a dam 2m high & approx 500m wide with a dry storage area behind, allowing for approx 88000m<sup>3</sup> during peak flows of Broadway, are between £2.5 - 3.0 m. This amount will require a further approval stage. All the evidence to date will go before a Project Assessment Board (PAB) in October for funding.

Channel maintenance within Childswickham and a series of small raised defences in & around Wickhamford is also planned.

Discussions are starting with those landowners affected by the scheme to obtain permission to carry out limited ground investigations work. to confirm-or-otherwise the geological information so far assumed from the ground investigation desk study already undertaken using geological maps. Assuming agreement with the PAB in October Wickhamford could be started ahead of the upstream storage Oct 2010 and Broadway, Childswickham, Murcot. 2011 through to 2012. The risks are landowner issues, ground conditions, planning/ environmental issues.

### **BROADWAY - REAL VILLAGE OR FILM SET?**

How many of you saw well-known TV personality Clare Balding's recent series on cycling round Britain, and heard her come to the conclusion that Broadway didn't feel like a real village, but was more like a film set? She felt that its prettiness and trimness were overdone – one of her criticisms seemed to be that there was not a scrap of litter to be seen! Her cycle route was following the path of an earlier cyclist of the 1950s whose comment on Broadway was that it was like a woman wearing too much mascara and lipstick.

Of course, the tourist's view of life here is bound to be very different from that of those of us who live here all year round.
