## BROADWAY COMMUNITY AWARD 2011

The award, which was founded by Broadway resident Walter Wentz, has been presented this year to not one, but four, winners. They are the Southern family, John, Tracy, Linda and Sue. Their annual show, Southern Nights, is the highlight of the year for many people in the village. It has been running for nine years and during that time they have raised over £30,000 for local charities. The original show was intended as a thank you to the local medical services for the care given to their terminally ill parents and to raise money for equipment. The Parish Council presented the family with a cheque for £100, which they have donated to the Campden Home Nursing Trust. The Southern family name has been duly added to the plaque listing winners of the award in the Lifford Hall.

## **NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL**

### **NEW COUNCIL MEMBERS**

Broadway Parish Council has co-opted two new council members: Dr Rachel Clements, who lives in Station Road, and Mrs Rosalind Rogers, who lives in Cheltenham Road. Both are looking forward to serving on the council.

### **HIGH STREET DRAINAGE WORK UPDATE**

Work has now begun on excavating the grass on the area alongside the footpath heading towards the War Memorial. Progress was hindered when the contractors found there were a number of service pipes to contend with in the Swan car park and the nearby carriageway. However, the next part of the work should progress much more smoothly, assuming no untoward obstacles are found.

### **REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 13TH**

The Royal British Legion Service of Remembrance will take place at the War Memorial at 10.30am. This will be followed by a service at St Michael's church. (There will be no 8am service of Holy Communion.)

## **NEWS FROM BROADWAY FIRST SCHOOL**

School opened on September 8th with 17 children starting school for the first time, and including 3 sets of twins, which is very unusual.

During the summer holidays the outside of the school and the railings were painted, a new security door was fitted and new windows were installed into the boys and girls and reception class toilets - that should keep them a lot warmer in those cold winter days.

## **BROADWAY STATION UPDATE**

The Broadway Area Group of the Gloucestershire Warwickshire Railway continues to make progress on the station reconstruction. This year has seen big changes to the appearance of the station site. We now have some 220 ft of platform built and edged with slabs in front of the foundations of the old station building. Thank you to all the people, including Friends of Broadway Station, who have sponsored one or more of these slabs. Work is now well under way on the construction of a further section of platform wall towards the road bridge. We are referring to this as platform 1A because there is currently a gap between it and the completed section (platform 1) to allow for vehicular access to the site. Some of the bricks we are using have come from the former platform 2 at Honeybourne station, and we hope to be able to get hold of some of the edging slabs from the same source. (Platform 2 at Honeybourne was recently rebuilt by Network Rail as part of the Cotswold Line redoubling project.) We have also obtained and are currently refurbishing some disused corrugated iron lamp huts from Ascott-under-Wychwood station. Initial contacts have now been made with the local planning and highways authorities to discuss the future development of the site.

The most obvious changes to be seen from the approach road are our information kiosk and shed.

How can you help us?

We have started having a sale of bric a brac here every Saturday to help raise funds. We will also have for sale Christmas cards with a picture, painted by railway artist Frederick Lea, of the 'Cornishman' Wolverhampton to Penzance express train passing through Broadway Station. In addition we will be selling raffle tickets to win an original painting by local artist Ian Gibson of the 'coffee pot' Cheltenham to Honeybourne train at Broadway station. Please come along and browse and see what we have achieved. We're happy to explain what we are doing, and to try to inspire you to join us!

Thank you to all who have shown an interest at these events and to those who have supported and provided assistance to us in various ways.

## **BROADWAY TRADERS LATE NIGHT SHOPPING EVENT**

This year late night shopping will take place on **Friday 25th November and Friday 2nd December** with shops and businesses remaining open until **8.30pm**. These shopping evenings are an opportunity to soak up the atmosphere of beautiful Broadway with its twinkling lights and the chance to shop on a traditional high street full of wonderful independent stores away from the hustle and bustle of busy town centres.

This year's attractions include Father Christmas on his own iconic red Routemaster double decker bus and pony and carriage rides up and down the High Street. There will be a variety of musical entertainment featuring Chipping Campden School Swing Band, the Celebration Reed and Brass Band, Worcester Salvation Army Band and Carol Singers. Local businesses and schools will be providing a range of festive refreshments around the village.

The Christmas Tree Festival will be on display in the United Reformed Church from Friday 2nd December until Sunday 4th December. The Tree of Light, organised by Dominique Hardiman for the fourth year, will be switched on at 7.30pm on Friday 2nd December on the village green. Anyone wishing to remember a departed loved one can obtain an application form from Dominique or from any of the four Broadway Churches. Each Tree of Light commemorative name will cost £5 and all proceeds will go to the Air Ambulance. There will be a short service on The Green before the Tree of Light is switched on.

The Broadway Traders Association really hope that you will join them for Late Night Shopping this year and would like to take this opportunity to thank all villagers for their fantastic support in previous years.

## **SOUTH WORCESTERSHIRE DEVELOPMENT PLAN**

A good number of Broadway residents were at the Lifford Hall on September 30 to view the display of information about the S Worcs Development Plan, as part of their public consultation. Of particular interest were the the proposed sites for building new houses – Station Road(40), Leamington Road (15, with 5 on the site of the Sheldon Road garages), and east of Kingsdale Road (12). Concerns were raised about the strains additional housing would put on the village infrastructure, notably drainage and sewerage, and whether the GP practice and the primary schools could cope with an influx of families. The hazards arising from the inevitable increase in traffic on the two main roads out of Broadway were also the subject of many comments.

### CLLR EYRE'S REPORT

**101 almost fully here** - The 101 number goes live in West Mercia on 3 October. However, the police have agreed to publicly launch 101, together with the other three forces in the West Midlands region, during early November. This is a new national non-emergency phone number that the public can use to contact their local police to report crime or antisocial behaviour that does not require an emergency response, for example:

- A car has been stolen
- Property has been damaged
- Drug dealing / use is suspected
- There has been a minor traffic collision
- To provide information about a crime

The police will be taking the opportunity to update the service provided to deaf, hard of hearing and speech-impaired callers.

How will it work? When a member of the public calls 101, the system determines the caller's location and connects them to the relevant police force. The caller will hear a recorded message announcing which force they are being connected to. If a caller is on a boundary between two or more forces, they will be given a choice of forces to be connected to. Call handlers in the force's control room will then answer the calls and respond appropriately.

How much does it cost to call? Calls to the 101 non-emergency number cost 15p for the entire call, no matter how long the call or what time of day it is. This applies to both landlines and mobile phones.

**Car parking fees** increased on 1st Oct, but the extra revenue should be used to improve local services.
