No sooner will the Jubilee Celebrations be over than the village will again be busy with the second Broadway Arts Festival. On Saturday 9th June children from the village will be parading down the High Street, showing off the big paper flowers they will have made to mark the theme of this year's Festival – Art and the Garden.

The Festival will be opened by the famous art historian and gardener Sir Roy Strong and Haines Gallery on the High Street will be hosting a fantastic Art Exhibition. This year the exhibition will largely feature work by Alfred Parsons, a wonderful painter of flowers and gardens who lived at Luggers Hill on Springfield Lane. He was also a highly acclaimed garden designer.

Parsons was a member of the Broadway Colony of artists who gathered and worked here in the late 19th century. More of the art painted by those artists and other influential artists of that period will be on display, including works by Constable, John Singer Sargent and Lucien Pissarro. It is a fantastic opportunity to see work that is usually in big art galleries or private collections.

Included in the Festival will be a jazz night in the marquee on the Green, a beautiful Flower Festival in St Michael's Church, a wonderful concert by the internationally renowned violinist Michael Bochmann with the harpist David Watkins and much more besides.

Visitors to the Festival are expected from places as far away as New York, Boston and Australia. Don't miss the opportunity to join in the celebration of Broadway's artistic heritage – here on your doorstep.

Broadway Station Update

The last update reported the start of construction of the southern section of the platform, and this is now almost complete. Our thanks go to everyone who has sponsored an edging slab for this section, and also to Broadway Parish Council, Broadway Traders and the Friends of the Cotswolds for their donations towards this project. Our Saturday bric a brac sales and raffle of a picture of the 'coffee pot' local train have also helped to raise much-needed funds. Work has now started on the construction of a further section of platform wall at the northern end. Our progress on these tasks has been greatly helped by a group of bricklaying students from Worcester College of Technology who have been able to gain work experience on a live building project. Clearance of vegetation in the proposed car park area is now almost complete. We have left a number of mature trees standing, and have put up some nesting boxes for the birds. The search for suitable bricks continues, and we have recently recovered 3500 bricks from a site in Taunton.

On Friday 18 May we will be holding an open evening at the station site between 6:30 and 8:30pm. There will be a band, BBQ and refreshments, and all are welcome to come along and see what we have achieved so far.

Coronation Chicken

It seems appropriate that we should be thinking about Coronation Chicken with Jubilee celebrations fast approaching. Apparently, versions of this dish, which was known as Jubilee Chicken, were created for the Silver Jubilee of George V in 1935 and then for the Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002.

There are still a myriad of versions of the dish around and no doubt we will see more over the coming months. I read somewhere that this was a 'retro classic best left in the 1950s'. My thoughts are that if made from scratch, it can be delicious. This is an updated version of the original creation by Rosemary Hume in 1953. I'm not sure fresh ginger, mango chutney or Greek yoghurt were much in evidence in 1953!

Serves 6

- 1 chicken, about 1.5kg
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 5 peppercorns
- Pinch of saffron
- 1tsp sea salt
- bay leaf
- 200ml mayonnaise
- 50g ready to eat dried apricots, finely chopped
- thumb size piece of fresh ginger
- 5 tbsps mango chutney
- 2 tbsps mild curry powder
- 200ml Greek yoghurt
- 2tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 50g flaked almonds
- Fresh coriander, chopped

Serve with a green salad and basmati rice or as an open sandwich

- 1 Put the chicken, breast side up, in a large pan along with the cinnamon, peppercorns, saffron, salt, bay leaf and half the ginger. Fill with cold water until only the breast is exposed. Cover with a lid and cook, bring to the boil and simmer very gently for about 1½ hrs until the juices run clear. Take out of the pan and leave to cool. Remove the meat in bitesize pieces when cool.
- 2 Finely chop the remaining ginger
- 3 Put the mango chutney and apricots into a large bowl. Toast the curry powder in a dry frying pan until fragrant, then add the chopped ginger and stir both into the bowl, followed by the Worcestershire sauce, mayonnaise and yoghurt. Season to taste.
- 4 Once the chicken is cold, fold it through the dressing and refrigerate for at least a couple of hours before folding through most of the coriander with the remainder sprinkled on top with the almonds.

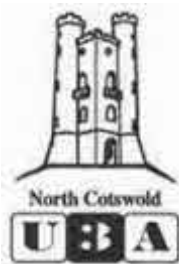
