CHAIRMAN CLLR DAVID FOLKES PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT

At the recent annual general meeting, I welcomed all present stating that since the elections last May it has been my pleasure to welcome two new Council members, Dr. Rachel Clements and Mrs. Ros. Rogers, both of whom I hope have settled in well to their role as Parish Councillors. I thanked Tim Greig, who stepped down in May since moving away from the area, for all his hard work and commitment during his time as parish councillor. I continued with a summary of all that had been achieved in the past year in Broadway:

The new toilet block in the Activity Park is well underway to completion;

In June, Councillor Mrs. Stock and the Clerk accompanied me to attend the official opening of the Shear House development which has created twelve new affordable homes for people with local connections;

A presentation in the Lifford Hall outlined plans for the South Worcestershire Development Plan for Broadway with sites for homes proposed in Station Road, Leamington Road and Kingsdale Court;

A public meeting was held in February to update the villagers on the proposed Badsey and Bunchers Brook flood alleviation scheme for Broadway, Childswickham with Murcot and to highlight the need for local community support towards the cost of this project;

Drainage work took place in the High Street during October and November, and the workmen must be commended for carrying out the work with as little inconvenience as possible, for the tidiness of the work, and the way everything was restored upon completion; I hope that everyone will benefit from the new trees planted along Station Road as they mature;

Our thanks must go to Maurice Parkinson, our lengthsmen, and Mrs. Dottie Friedli, for all their help in keeping the Millennium Garden looking so good by carrying out a make-over during the year, and also installing a new seat in place of one which had collapsed;

Two grants of £250 each were again made available to complete litter picks in the village undertaken this year by members of Broadway United Youth Football Club and Broadway Cricket Club, both of whom carried out such a wonderful job in clearing rubbish that the grants will be made available again during 2012;

Thanks to the persistence of Mrs. Dennis of Bricknell Cottage and with the co-operation of the Parish Council, the area at the bottom of Springfield Lane, formerly known as China Square, now has a plaque marking its location;

I accepted two invitations to Broadway Library during the year to make presentations to village children who had taken part in local competitions;

Although the village thankfully did not suffer adverse winter weather as it had previously experienced, additional grit bins have been purchased and installed by the roundabout in the High Street, Morris Road, and Bibsworth Avenue. Our lengthsmen, Maurice Parkinson, and his brother have been appointed to clear the roads in Broadway on behalf of the County Council, and they have also agreed to clear the minor roads around the village;

The penultimate phase of the painting of the village light columns has now been completed;

The Parish Council, together with several organisations with which she was associated, and members of her family, marked the sad loss of Mrs. Jill Cross during the year with the purchase of a seat in her memory which was placed along Station Road;

Following the withdrawal of part of the route of the 559 bus service, Cresswell Bus Company has started a service to Evesham from Childswickham via Broadway on Tuesdays and Thursdays which has been well supported. I would like to encourage everyone to continue to support this vital link into Evesham for those who have no transport of their own. Our thanks must go to Councillor Mrs. Stephenson for her help in getting this project off the ground. The Evesham Volunteer Centre gave a presentation to the Parish Council highlighting how its services can also help such residents with assistance in getting to hospital, doctors, shopping, etc., and I would ask that this service be made known to anyone who you feel may benefit;

'TOP SECRET BOEING'

The RAF Airfield at Defford, which was built partly in the grounds of Croome Park, the seat of the Earls of Coventry (who built Broadway Tower), was one of the most secret places in Britain during the Second World War. For it was at Defford that the radar systems which helped win the war for the Allies, were tested and proven. A new book by Broadway author Bob Shaw, 'Top Secret Boeing' lifts the veil of secrecy by telling the life story of a unique and remarkable aircraft, a Boeing 247D, which flew with the RAF at Defford to play a key part in winning the Radar Battles of the Second World War. The old airliner earned the affection of scientists and airmen alike, who found it to be the ideal tool for radar research. They all called it simply 'The Boeing'.

A secret mission to Washington in 1940, approved by Winston Churchill and agreed by President Roosevelt, plucked 'The Boeing' from obscurity. It was chosen as a demonstrator for the prototype American 10cm air intercept radar (based on the British invention, the magnetron), and sent to Britain, where it became serial number DZ203 with the RAF. Thereafter it was flown intensively on a variety of radar projects.

In its ultimate achievement, in January 1945 at Defford, 'The Boeing' achieved the World's First automatic orbit, approach and blind landing, pointing the way to the ability of airliners to operate in all weathers and darkness which we take for granted today.

This book will appeal to anyone who is an aircraft 'buff' and anyone interested in aviation history, especially with its local connections. Many local people will have family or know someone who served at Defford, and would like to know more about 'The Secret Airfield'.

'Top Secret Boeing' is on sale at Blandford Books in Broadway, or in the National Trust shop at Croome Park.

MEMORIAL SEAT

The Cotswold Wardens have now installed a seat in memory of David Jelfs. The seat is at the top of the first field of Tower Farm, alongside the Cotswold Way and the wall now being rebuilt. Both of these were close to David's heart, so the location makes a fitting tribute.

Panna cotta with Summer Fruits (Serves 4)

I hear rumour of an Italian Restaurant due to open soon in Broadway!

Perhaps this typically Italian dessert might be a suitable introduction to Italian cuisine.

Panna cotta is such a simple dish to make. You can change its character with all sorts of flavours.

Panna cotta

2 x 2g leaves gelatine (be sure to use leaves, available in major supermarkets and The Broadway Deli!)

300ml double cream

115g castor sugar

100ml full fat milk

50ml buttermilk

1 vanilla Pod, split lengthways, seeds scraped out

For the sauce:

175g sugar

175ml water

12oz raspberries

splash of cherry liqueur, Cointreau or something similar

Soak the gelatine leaves in cold water. Pour the cream into a saucepan, add the sugar, vanilla pod and seeds and heat gently, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Bring just to a simmer and remove from the heat and discard the vanilla pod.

Squeeze the water out of the gelatine and stir it into the cream mixture to dissolve. Pour through a sieve into a clean bowl and stir in the milk and buttermilk. Add more sugar if needed.

Grease this inside of 4 small ramekins and divide the mixture between them. Cool and then refrigerate for at least 4 hours or overnight.

For the sauce, place the sugar, water and liqueur into a pan and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat and simmer until the sugar has dissolved.

Remove the pan from the heat, blend until smooth and pass through a sieve.

Stir the remaining raspberries into the sauce.

To serve, briefly dip the ramekins into boiling water and invert on to plates.

Spoon the cooled sauce over and decorate with a sprig of mint.

Enjoy this little plate of delights!

The Old Station House is welcoming guests to Broadway again. Following a change of ownership, the Old Station House has been closed for refurbishment prior to opening in time for the Cheltenham Festival week.

New owners, Jenni Morrison and Andy Stevens moved into the area last year and are delighted that they chose to come to Broadway.

Jenni comes from a strong customer service background having started as an air stewardess, progressing to senior management posts in travel related companies. "I decided to try bed and breakfast in a small way a few years ago and enjoyed it so much I wanted to try on a larger scale" said Jenni. "We travelled around staying in B&Bs looking for our ideal place and narrowed it down to the Cotswolds and then Broadway. We have been made very welcome by people from all walks of life here and have had lots of help and support from business people in the area. Now that we are up and running I'm really looking forward to playing a part in the life of Broadway."

Andy joined the Royal Air Force at eighteen and flew the Jaguar, mostly in Germany during the "Cold War". TIME SHIFT – CAN YOU REMEMBER?



Several artefacts have been found whilst digging in the earth bank and on Saturday 2nd of June one of the three volunteers searching for bricks on the old No 2 platform made a find. These were coping slabs buried beneath the soil, placed as though they were two steps; it is thought leading to the footbridge that spans the track between platforms 1 & 2.
