
ARTS FESTIVAL 'A GREAT SUCCESS'

Despite wet and windy weather during most of the Arts Festival week, it was hailed as a great success by the many people who attended, with some visitors coming from as far away as America, Australia and New Zealand. Shops and hotels in the village reported an increase in trade during the week and the stunning Art Exhibition held at Haynes Gallery received tremendous acclaim.

Many children from Broadway joined the parade down the High Street to the Green and the production of J M Barrie's Peter Pan was greatly enjoyed by those who saw it and were involved in its production. The marquee on the Green provided an excellent venue for a number of art classes led by a number of highly popular and respected artists; a fantastic jazz night; a Vince Freeman concert; and Noel Coward's 'Private Lives' performed by Heartbreak Productions on the Saturday night was a sell out.

The national Art Competition held at Little Buckland gallery attracted an extremely high standard of work and over three hundred entries, there was an opportunity for young local talent to display their work in an exhibition of 'Youth Art' at the Lifford Hall and a charming display of photographs of Old Broadway and members of the Broadway Colony in the parlour.

Sir Roy Strong, who opened the Festival, thought that the flowers at St Michael's Church were an absolute delight and declared the Art Exhibition to be unique in his experience in the way that it so beautifully captured the bucolic idyll of the English countryside and the essence of romantic rural England.



Altogether the Festival was a wonderful achievement and the Trustees and Management Committee of the Festival would like to thank all the many people who were involved in making the Festival such a wonderful and memorable event.

WHAT'S HAPPENING NOW WITH......

The Library

In the absence of any affordable solutions to retaining the existing library building an exercise was undertaken to explore alternative funding models that could enable a library service to remain in Broadway. Representatives of the Parish council, Police and the Authority's Property and Libraries Services, are looking for a solution together ways to find regular income that might support the running costs of a multi-purpose community library building. A key consideration is that the current Library is situated in the right place for the Broadway community and therefore any scheme that might enable this should be fully explored. If there is no solution at present, alternative options will be given full consideration. Clearly many questions remain to be answered. The next PC meeting is 23rd August – check up on the minutes if you missed it.

The Ashmolean

The project is coming on quite well. Fund raising is moving along with my recent successful 25k bid for European Leader funds. The tendering stage for the building conversion comes to an end on 17th August. It is hoped conversion work will start in September. A community update event is being planned for the Autumn. The Corporate, Benefactor, Patron, Friends programme will soon be launched. The Museum is still on track to be opened around the end of March 2012. The Development of Broadway and South Worcestershire

Decisions taken in the next few weeks could change the face of Broadway and South Worcestershire. The three District councils of South Worcestershire, including Wychavon, over the summer have been consulting on major changes to their "preferred options" for where houses should go over up to 2030. This consultation is the last phase in the establishment of the local development plan. Residents should not wake up to these issues when it's too late.

The three councils are finishing their detailed consultation process. This last stage has to be quite speedy because the longer the Councils were without a plan the more at risk there was to our fields throughout the District to speculative development in the wrong place. The South Worcestershire development plan website shows how your community may be affected by the changes, if you didn't manage to go to the public consultation sessions around Wychavon as Kevin the Parish Clerk. You can you're your views known until consultation closes on 14th September. Finally, there will be a full consultation on the plan itself which will begin in November, with the public examination of the plan next Spring.

COOKERY CORNER

To keep the Italian theme going, here is a delicious recipe, which makes good use of your courgette harvest. Orzo is a rice-like pasta, well worth seeking out and readily available in The Broadway Deli. I was asked recently for recipes for one person, well this can easily be reduced by a quarter and still be delicious.

Orzo with courgettes and grana padano

To serve 4

- 300g Orzo
- 150g pancetta (in one piece)
- 1 large onion
- 2 tbsps olive oil
- 250ml white wine
- 4 medium courgettes
- 100g grana padano or parmesan cheese, grated
- Tip the pasta into a deep pan of boiling and salted water for about 9 minutes until the pasta is soft. It should still have a gentle bite to it. Drain once cooked.
- 2. Cut the pancetta into large dice.
- 3. Peel and chop the onion and fry together with the pancetta in the olive oil, over a moderate heat. You will need to use a heavy bottomed and shallow pan.
- 4. Cook for 15 minutes and stir frequently until the onions are translucent and the pancetta fat is slightly amber.
- 5. Pour in the wine, turn up the heat and allow it to bubble away until reduced by half.
- 6. Slice the courgettes lengthways and then into thick slices and add to the pan.
- Season with salt and pepper and allow to cook for 8-10 minutes before adding the drained Orzo and the cheese.
- 8. The cheese should melt a little into the pasta to make it stick together.

It's a dish that is delicious served on its own or you could try it as side dish to Saltimbocca. (recipe to follow!).
