ASHMOLEAN MUSEUM OPENING

The new Ashmolean Museum Broadway opened its doors to the public on Saturday 7th September 2013! It will now be open 10am - 5pm, Tuesdays - Sundays. Admission charges are £6 for adults, £5 for concessions, and possibly further reductions for local residents.

Through developing the new displays for the Ashmolean Museum Broadway, our Conservation and Curatorial staff have made new discoveries and carried out work to enable objects to be displayed to the public in the new Museum at Broadway. These include the Landseer painting 'Two studies of a Stag Head'. It came to the Ashmolean in 1935 with one half of the picture folded around the back so that the Stag's heads were on opposite sides. However over the years a series of tears had developed along the folded edges with associated paint loss. It was clear that the picture had to be unfolded and returned to its original format in order to stabilise and repair it. The surface of the picture had also become noticeably dirty, considerably

masking its appearance. During conservation a number of labels and stamps were discovered on the back of the picture. These revealed amongst other things that the canvas had been imported and supplied by the colourman Thomas Brown of High Holborn.

The pupils in Key Stage Two have been enjoying an enriched curriculum which has allowed them to learn a variety of skills with the help of local businesses. The winning bread was very successfully sold in store. The Year Four class have worked with 'Prego' restaurant and learnt to create their own pizzas. The winning pizza was put on the Prego menu and the pizza boxes designed by the pupils were displayed in the restaurant.

Another opportunity to work with local business came from George Davies and the team at the Draycote Design centre. Our Y5/6 pupils enjoyed designing an outfit to pitch to the team. All teams were declared the winner due to the quality of the designs produced.

We are very grateful to these local businesses and

their staff for providing our pupils with such inspiring learning opportunities.

In the Summer we congratulated our Executive Head Teacher, Mrs J Le Maitre for achieving 'National Leader of Education' Status. This will enable her to share her knowledge and expertise with schools needing support.

We have been delighted to complete the first phase of our ICT development project. This is thanks to the generosity of the Parish Council and local trusts. The Friends of St Mary's have also worked tirelessly throughout the year to fund raise and contribute a significant amount towards the project. We are now working on the next phase to provide further upgraded ICT resources for the pupils.

We will be holding an Open Afternoon in November and very much welcome visits from the local community to come and see our school.

Does anyone in the village have any images (photos or postcards) of Broadway during the early 1900s? I am particularly looking for images of Fox Yard, China Square, Phillipps' Cottages, Council Cottages (Leamington Road), Russell House and Barn House as these are all places where some of the men on the memorial lived prior to going to war. If possible I would like to use some of the images in my forthcoming book on the Memorial.

Please do contact me if you have any information, photos or stories about any of the 48 men who are listed on the Memorial who died in the First World War. I have put together some very interesting biographies about many of the men. In particular I would love to hear from anybody who can help with Pte. William Gardner, Mechanical Transport Unit of the Army Service Corps. William is commemorated on the Memorial, however, he is not recognised by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as being a casualty of the war nor is he listed in the publication 'Soldiers died in the Great War' (including alternative spellings of his surname). I have found records for a William Gardner, born Broadway, son of John Gardner and Emma Gardner (née Keyte), in both the 1901 and 1911 censuses but cannot find any record of his enlistment or service other than a short reference to him in the Evesham Journal in March 1916. Does anyone have any recollection of the Gardner family living in Church Street, Broadway, or perhaps know whether there are any Gardners still living locally? It would be great to confirm his enlistment and date of death in service as William could then be recognised by the CWGC as being a casualty of the war.

LIBRARY CONSULTATION UPDATES

The recent consultation on options for Broadway library ended on July 12, 2013 and on August 1 there was an informal feedback meeting at the library to update on progress and the next steps. There has been fantastic support and enthusiasm from the local community.

In the options identified, option 2 which involves establishing a Community Group to take on the management of the library building, was the local community's favoured option. Overall 74% of the consultation respondents are in agreement with option 2, compared to 26% who disagree.

In total, there were 173 respondents to the Broadway consultation. This is a very good return rate for the size of the community, and more than some of the larger libraries we consulted upon in 2012.

28 people have expressed an interest in forming the Broadway Community Group, all bringing a wide range of skills and experience. 30 people also came forward interested in helping to support the paid staff at the library, either offering time across one or more roles.

Of the specific roles, meeting and greeting customers, assisting customers in borrowing books and stock keeping were the most popular options. The other suggested roles involved organising film clubs, dance clubs, theatrical groups and other social events.

Next Steps

A number of more formal meetings will be scheduled late September / early October for Community Group volunteers (further details to follow in local press and via Broadway library). At these meetings members of the local community who expressed an interest in forming a Community Group can come along and discuss the next steps and begin to take forward the project. For those that expressed an interest in volunteering to support the paid staff will be contacted by the Library to discuss opportunities.

Cllr Liz Eyre, Cabinet Member for Children and Families and Broadway Local Member, said:

"This is a really positive outcome for the village. We are not talking closure and there is the opportunity to keep those important professional library services. It's now up to the community to pull together to maintain the building and create a flexible exciting hub that really meets the needs of our community"

However, if the local community could not come forward to volunteer an alternative option would need to be explored"

Cllr Lucy Hodgson, Cabinet Member for Localism and Communities, said:

"Despite the pressures on budgets we have not yet closed one library service in Worcestershire, this is because of the approach we have adopted has not been a simple 'one size fits all'.

By working with communities bespoke locally-led solutions have been found. Catshill and Pershore libraries being two of many good examples"
