So, my congratulations to you all, and my thanks also to everyone who helped with the preparations for the judges' visit.

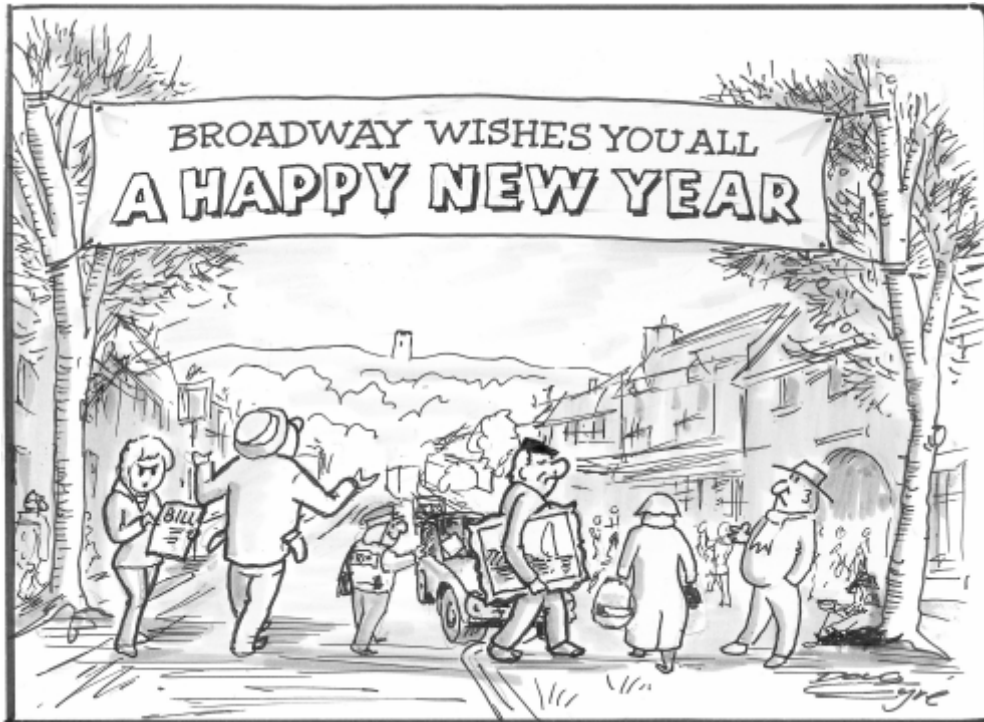
If you have any ideas as to which

The Youth Centre recently became host on Monday evenings to the first class outside London to be run by a martial arts school based in the capital's Chinese Community Centre.

London Chinatown Tae Kwon Do was established nearly four years ago and many top martial artists, including a British Champion, train there. One of its founders, Neil Hall, who lives near Broadway, decided he wanted to bring the same inspiration to as many people as possible.

"The Youth Centre was a natural choice for our first class because of its welcoming atmosphere and the wonderful enthusiasm of the people there," says Neil. "We've been really impressed by the students of all ages and I'm sure that before long Broadway will have champions of its own."

WHEELIE BINS COMING TO BROADWAY SOON

Wychavon District Council will shortly be replacing our plastic bin bags with wheelie bins.

Each household will be given a green bin for recyclable waste and a grey bin for non-recyclable waste. These will be emptied on alternate weeks.

In addition, there will be a smaller grey bin for food waste which will be emptied weekly.

If you feel you may have a problem with the new system, contact Wychavon Client Services on 01386 565006, as exemptions can be made and the plastic bag collection retained in certain circumstances.

ACTIVITY PARK UPDATE

Work on the new Activity Park got off to a good start but has slowed recently because of bad weather. The tarmac for the MUGA site should now be finished and the grass seed on the football pitch should be germinating well.

Many of you will have seen that the stone climbing wall in the central area is in place and the whole of the hollow in front has been dug out. The area for the very young children has been excavated and the stone laid. Work on the zip wire has also begun. Applications for funding are progressing. The first batch of equipment is now in store in Cheltenham prior to assembly before being installed on the playground.
