ACTIVITY PARK – OFFICIAL OPENING!

Right on time and on budget, Saturday May 9th at 1pm will see the official opening of Broadway's new Activity Park. The ceremony will be performed by the Chairman of the Parish Council, David Folkes, assisted by pupils representing the schools who played such a large part in the planning, including our own Broadway First School and St Mary's School.

The money for this enterprise came from five main providers, together with individual contributions from Broadway residents; in addition a dedicated sub-committee of the Parish Council has given hours of their time to the project. The carefully planned and designed area aims to give people of all ages, from 2 year olds to twenty-two, challenging equipment that encourages risk-taking in a series of graded areas. In



this way, each user, whatever their age, can find their own comfort level. There is something for everyone, all year round and in all weathers.

The Parish Council hopes that everyone in the village will realise the value of this splendid addition to our facilities, accept it as their space and treat it with

the respect it deserves. Money has been set aside to pay for maintenance and an annual inspection, but if you would like to help out with keeping the area tidy, then please contact the Parish Clerk, Kevin Beasley.

As some Broadway's twenty-somethings commented recently, when looking at the all-weather area, 'It's great – why didn't we have something like this when we were growing up?'

So come along on May 9. Hot dogs and other refreshments will be available – and there may even be a band!

ST EADBURGHAS NORMAL 'SERVICE' IS RESUMED

The structural work necessary to restore St Eadburgha's Church, damaged in the flooding of July 2007, has now been completed and once again the church is open for all to come and visit. The tombstones that were exposed when the floor of the nave collapsed have been incorporated into the restoration and the whole space of the nave can now be seen in all its romanesque glory.

The damaged pews are to be replaced by open-backed benches and the lengthy procedure to reach agreement on their design is nearing conclusion. In the meantime, chairs will be provided and Sunday evening services have been resumed – Evensong at 6pm, and Holy Communion on the third Sunday in the month.

To celebrate the completion of the restoration there will be a concert on the evening of Thursday, June 25th by the St James Singers and Players.

Then on the afternoon of Thursday July 9th, Claire Jones, harpist to the Prince of Wales, will give a recital as part of the Cheltenham Music Festival.

Finally, on the weekend of August 22/23 there will be an exhibition of the paintings of Jeremy Houghton.

The AGM of the Friends of St Eadburgha's will be held on Wednesday 13 May at 5pm at the church.

THE GORDON RUSSELL FURNITURE AND DECORATIVE ARTS MUSEUM

The Museum is pleased to announce that it has once again received a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund totalling £17,600, for an educational project, 'Designing for the Future'. The grant will enable the Trust to embark on a training scheme for volunteers with an interest in or experience of teaching.

The principal objectives of the scheme are:

1 Provide a structured training programme to support volunteers to enable them to deliver learning sessions to secondary school groups visiting the museum.

2 Share the collection, archives and industrial history linked to the work of Sir Gordon Russell with KS3 and 4 pupils through seminars at the museum.

3 Create an outreach 'museum in a box', with information, design notes and handling materials for use as a resource in secondary schools. Following the opening of the Museum just over a year ago, a number of very successful school and workshop seminars have been held there. The new initiative will be entirely pro-active as it will enable presentations to be made in schools as well as encouraging visits by groups to the museum.

The resource box – in effect a mini travelling exhibition – will appeal to all ages. In the case of Design and Technology students, it will highlight career opportunities for young designers and makers.
