BROADWAY ARTS FESTIVAL

Saturday 13th June saw the community launch of Broadway Arts Festival, scheduled for June 2010. This event, staged in Russell Square, invited villagers to find out about plans so far, and to get involved – with ideas for Festival activities, practical help or sponsorship, whilst enjoying fizz and strawberries provided by Warner's Budgens. The *Friends of Broadway Arts Festival* scheme was successfully launched enabling people to become a Friend, Patron or Benefactor of the Festival. Significant numbers signed up on the day. Applications are open to all.

Current plans include an exhibition of works by John Singer Sargent, walks, talks, lectures and tours, theatre and music evenings, a Gala Ball and a village party.

Hugh Brewster, renowned historical author and expert on Sargent flew over from his base in Toronto to support the launch, and completed a number of engagements including book signings, lectures, an address at the launch dinner and talks to the children of Broadway First School and St Mary's Catholic Primary School.

FLOODING – PROGRESS REPORT FROM COUNCILLOR LIZ EYRE

Agencies involved have undertaken detailed technical investigations into the issues associated with the flooding in July 2007 and surface water problems in Broadway and a number of projects are underway.

Upper High Street - review of spring run off, culvert design issues, partial blockages within the stone culvert under private land and improvements to the grid on the culvert entrance.

Bypass Drainage System – design and maintenance.

Leamington Road - remedial Severn Trent scheme awaiting Severn Trent funding.

The Retreat – mainly a Church and Severn Trent issue

Leamington Road North -work scheduled for late August/September 2009.

High Street and adjacent to No. 75 – several land owner issues
High Street – stone culvert replacement - work is underway to plan a scheme, identify the size of the project, and understand its impact.

Back Lane junction with High Street – a new connection is proposed from the existing Back Lane highway drain with a provisional date in September/October 2009. An additional extension to the scheme involving Station Road is being considered.

High Street drainage gullies – mostly cleansed. A “HOT SPOT” list for difficult areas has been created. A request has been made for the cleaning of gullies in the Upper High Street. The County is in the process of mapping all gullies and their condition for a review of the cleansing rota so that in the future problem areas are already known.

Snowhill Road surface water - run off from private land starts at an area near a cattle grid. This is being investigated; possible alterations may be made to ditch lines.

NB-Blocked or slow running gullies and ditches are to be part of the duties of the Broadway PC lengthsman, together with the cleaning of headwalls etc. Fault reports can be made directly to the Parish Clerk who can inform the Control Centre at County Hall.

Special Flood Alleviation Projects

Environment Authority Schemes for Badsey Brook – modelling continues for the three villages :

Broadway Phase 1 upstream " Holding Reservoir" above Lifford Gardens and associated ditch works to Bunches Brook.

Childswickham and Murcot Phase 2 Enlargement of Stream to provide storage and to create overflow into Badsey Brook, together with the upgrade to culverts at Broadway road, Childswickham and road to Murcot.

Wickhamford Phase 3 provision of flood defences and construction of additional culvert under the private right of way at Wickhamford Lane (*Update in September*).

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS:

At the recent AGM, Councillor David Folkes was re-elected as Chairman of the Parish Council; Councillor Red Haslam was also re-elected as Vice-Chairman. The committees were also all re-elected; details can be found on the Parish Council noticeboard.

Date for the next Parish Council Meetings is August 27th at the Parish Office in Broadway, starting at 7.00pm. All are welcome to attend.

The Parish Council agreed in principle, to joining up with other local parishes to purchase a mobile vehicle - activated speed sign. We will keep you informed on progress.

The County Council has agreed to install grit bins in the following roads: Sandscroft Avenue, Lime Tree Avenue, Bloxham Road, Church Street and Fish Hill. These bins should be installed during September/October in readiness for the winter.

WPC Greenhouse has reported a decrease in the overall crime figures for Broadway over the last three year period. To maintain this encouraging trend, all residents are asked to remain vigilant and to report any suspicious incidents to the Police, telephone number 08457 444888 ext 3777 or 999 if it is an emergency.
