The Guides were founded in September 1919 by Honora Auda Ayshford Sandford a distant cousin of Lord Baden Powell. The Brownies were added in October 1924. They continued (with a gap for the war years) as a meeting point for girls from all backgrounds right up to 2000. The unit as it is today was re-registered in June 2001 and now meets in the URC Hall every Monday at 7:00pm. Everyone is looking forward to the special centenary celebrations including the Danceathon at Hanbury Hall and a sleepover at Alton Towers!

# A HOMAGE TO HARRY, TRIBUTE TO A VALE SOLDIER by MAUREEN M SMITH

Mary Smith, as many of you will know her, was born and bred in Broadway, as was her mother, grandmother, and great grandmother. She is now retired, after working for Wychavon District Council as a Senior Home Care Assistant for seventeen years. She joined Broadway TIC as a volunteer and was sent on a computer course at Evesham Library. She then bought a lap-top and set to work. Her cousin had given her some old photos of her father's brother Harry Hancock on the battlefield of Ypres in World War 1, and with the help of family members and much research, she has written a book about his short life. Harry Hancock was born in Cow, Honeybourne in 1898 and joined The King's Shropshire Light Infantry in 1914, when he was just 16 years old. The book charts his life from birth through to his untimely death at The Battle of Passchendaele in 1917, aged just 19 years.

#### WHERE IN BROADWAY?

My thanks to all you villagers who helped in identifying the various unknown place names in the 1891 and 1901 Census, and particularly to Peggy Hancock who gave me a comprehensive reply. Here, then, are the locations of places I can identify with reasonable confidence.

**Acton House** – the former Co-op shop next to Prior's Manse which was demolished.

Alderton House - just below the "Lygon Arms", now

Aldington Lodge - immediately below Broad Close field, with a statue in garden.

Argyle Parade – where Ashmore's and Cotswold Building Supplies are situated.

**Belleview** – now called "Meadow Cottage" at the end of Morris Rd.

**Buckland Villa** – the two empty shops immediately below the Methodist Church.

Fox Yard – where Les Arnold's Wine Shop used to be. Heek's Yard -the ground behind Monk's House in the Upper High Street.

Mayfield - 88/90 High Street, where 'Fenwick & Fenwick' is situated.

Portway Villa - on the right hand side of the Cheltenham R, just past the two brick cottages.

Ram's Alley -alongside 101 High Street. Probably so called because the rams were taken along that way while the ewes went along a path lower down the High Street

Roseville - former name of 'Fencote', opposite old Coach & Horses in Upper High Street. Rebuilt after a fire in 1930's.

Smallbrook Cottage – on the corner at the bottom of the Leamington Rd.

**South View** – now known as Broad Close where OKA is now trading.

**Sunnyside** – No. 72 High Street where the Xmas shop is

Sylvan Villa – probably now known as Mill Hay House on the Snowshill Rd.

**Vineyard** – the last house in Broadway on the Willersey Rd., just before the field.

Westonville – the next house up from 'Sunnyside' on the Upper High St. Neil Hilton

#### **BROADWAY COMMUNITY AWARD WINNER 2009**

Broadway Parish Council announced at its meeting held on Thursday 22nd October, that the winner of the 2009 Broadway Community Award was Mrs Frieda Jelfs.

The award was set up in 2000 by Doctor Walter Wentz, an American, who moved to Broadway over ten years ago and had been so overwhelmed by the welcome he received that he decided to set up a scheme to reward hardworking villagers.

Mrs Jelfs' name has now been added to the list of eight previous winners on a plaque, which is displayed in the Lifford Hall, and she also received a cheque for £100.00, which was given to her chosen charity – Campden Home Nursing.

Mrs Jelfs was a teacher at Kirtlands Preparatory School in Broadway for ten years and the head for seventeen years. She was a member of the Broadway Choir for over forty years, and the leader of the Broadway Music Makers for ten years until her recent retirement. Her services to musical appreciation within the village, particularly the presentation and conducting of popular choral concerts at the Lifford Hall, raised donations for local charities amounting to almost £5000. and other organisations benefited from her talents during the last thirty years including the annual pantomime, the Meon Choir, the Broadway Players and local schools.
