GWSR PROGRESS TO BROADWAY

The Gloucestershire Warwickshire Railway's progress on its extension from Toddington to Broadway has reached the halfway point at Laver-ton. The 'missing' bridge there has now been rebuilt and track will soon be extended across it. There are three more road bridges that require refurbishment. Repairs, currently being assessed, will need to be completed before the line can reach Broadway and, inevitably, these will be costly projects.

Preliminary work at Broadway has progressed on two fronts. Physical work at the old station has seen the site cleared and the foundations of the old platforms and buildings exposed. In tandem with the physical work, the requirements for a rebuilt station have been debated and the design objectives identified. We aim to restore the station as closely to its original appearance as possible, consistent with material availability and current requirements.

BROADWAY FIRST SCHOOL

This term started with a heavy snowfall which provided a white wonderland of undisturbed snow which the children enjoyed at playtime, making snowmen or just running through the soft deep snow. This was especially magical for a boy who originates from Sri Lanka who had never seen snow before. The children produced some lovely poetry and artwork based on their experiences.

Charitable activities this half term have included a talk by Sue McClelland from Acorns Hospice about the work of the Hospice in Worcester. Later on, the children came to school dressed red and blue and raised £300 for the Haiti Earthquake Appeal. In February we held a 'Sockathon' on Sports Relief Day, February 19th.

The children have been out of school to visit the Olympic Museum Bus, St.Michael's Church and the Broadway Library. Classes 3 and 4 have been very busy creating biscuits and making moving models using cams. Years 4 and 5 took part in Cycle Proficiency lessons with the road safety trainer. They learned how to ride their cycles correctly and to make sure their cycle was safe to ride on.

Our after school clubs have provided the children with different opportunities to develop their skills and to keep fit. The clubs have been dance; school newspaper; art; science; cooking and crafts and quilling. Not wanting to leave the parents out, we have had Parent Information evenings about 'Internet Safety', and 'Helping Your Child to Read'. The half term ended with a school disco organised by the Friends Association, where the children (and some of the parents) showed us some amazing dance moves!

MOON CRATERS ON BACK LANE

After the recent bad weather has drawn attention to the numerous craters which afflict the county's roads and we are being asked to ring the hot line with nominations for treatment is it not time we looked at our own back yard - Back lane in fact?

For a long time now residents have been negotiating these hazards which have become really dangerous especially to the blind and partially sighted not to mention the buggies and pushchairs etc. Parked cars mean you can't even walk on the verge of the road to try to avoid them. The authorities will say they do not know who owns this piece of road but surely some one can be persuaded to dump a load of chippings to fill in these deep craters before someone has a really nasty accident. *John Hincks*

It's good to be able to give a prompt reply to this letter. Wychavon has issued details of their plans for dealing with the damage our roads have recently suffered.

The county council's road crews had more than 100 potholes reported to them within 5 days of the main cold snap ceasing. Since then the calls have poured in daily to the Worcestershire Hub. Nearly 1,500 potholes have been repaired since the bad weather struck in January, significantly more than the number of potholes reported to them by the public (1267).

Dealing with the pothole problem will prove costly this year for the County Council but drivers should be reassured that work gangs will be out repairing roads in the coming weeks with priority roads such as A-roads and school routes first in line for repairs.

Cash for the backlog of repairs will have to come out of the remaining road maintenance budget.

SHEAR HOUSE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

In response to the article in the January Newsletter, Keith Chamberlain has sent us a copy of the letter he wrote to the Parish Council making a number of additional points about the proposed development. He points out that the loss of 72 parking places will be a severe blow to the parents collecting children from St Mary's School, as well as putting undue pressure on the village when events such as the Christmas Late Night Opening evenings or Giffords Circus are held. Already there are signs that the Sands residential area is being used by visitors when the Leamington Road car park is full; this will become even more common with the ensuing loss. Mr Chamberlain also points out the pressure on the infrastructure of Broadway. The sewerage system in the Leamington Road area has proved inadequate; extra housing will only serve to make matters worse.

Nevertheless, a start on the building is due get under way at the beginning of March when Rooftops Housing Group will erect a hoarding around the site. Once the hoarding is up parking in that section, and also the toilet facilities, will no longer be available. Additional signage will be put in place to indicate alternative parking and toilets. The number of parking spaces open to the general public at Shear House will then be reduced to 63.

E F BENSON'S LUCIA NOVELS

Does anyone in Broadway still read the 'Lucia' novels by E F Benson?

The Newsletter has been contacted by a family who will be visiting Broadway briefly in May and in addition to enjoying the charming village will be interested to see how it compares with Riseholme, the village apparently based on Broadway which features in 'Lucia' novels.
